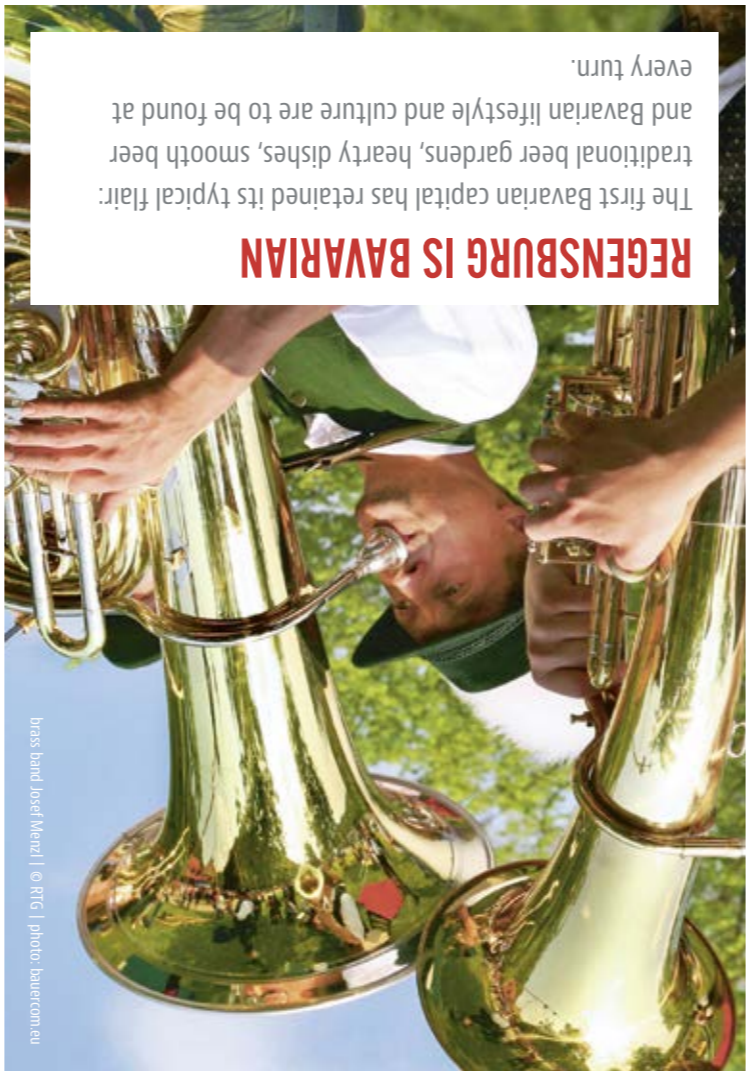

**REGENSBURG IS BAVARIAN**

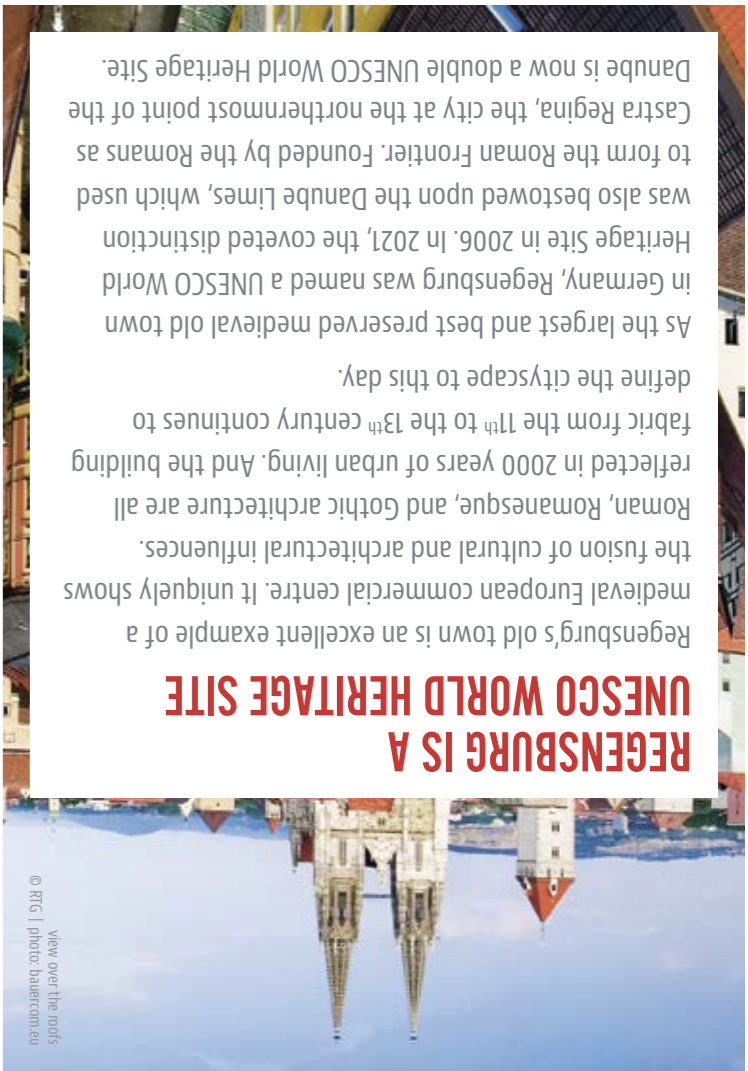

**REGENSBURG IS LIVING HISTORY**

**179 AD:** Founding of the Roman legion camp Castra Regina | **6<sup>th</sup> century:** First capital of Bavaria | **1135-1146:** Construction of the Stone Bridge | **From 1245:** Free Imperial City (until 1803) | **around 1260:** Construction begins on the Gothic cathedral | **1663-1806:** Perpetual Diet at Regensburg | **1806:** The "Holy Roman Empire of the German Nation" dissolved in Regensburg | **2006:** Naming as UNESCO World Heritage Site and visit by Pope Benedict XVI | **2021:** Danube Limes named a UNESCO World Heritage Site and Regensburg becomes a double UNESCO World Heritage-listed city.

**REGENSBURG IS A UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE**

Regensburg's old town is an excellent example of a medieval European commercial centre. It uniquely shows the fusion of cultural and architectural influences: Roman, Romanesque, and Gothic architecture are all reflected in 2000 years of urban living. And the building fabric from the 11<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup> century continues to define the cityscape to this day.

As the largest and best preserved medieval old town in Germany, Regensburg was named a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2006. In 2021, the coveted distinction was also bestowed upon the Danube Limes, which used to form the Roman Frontier. Founded by the Romans as Castra Regina, the city at the northernmost point of the Danube is now a double UNESCO World Heritage Site.

**REGENSBURG IS CULTURE**

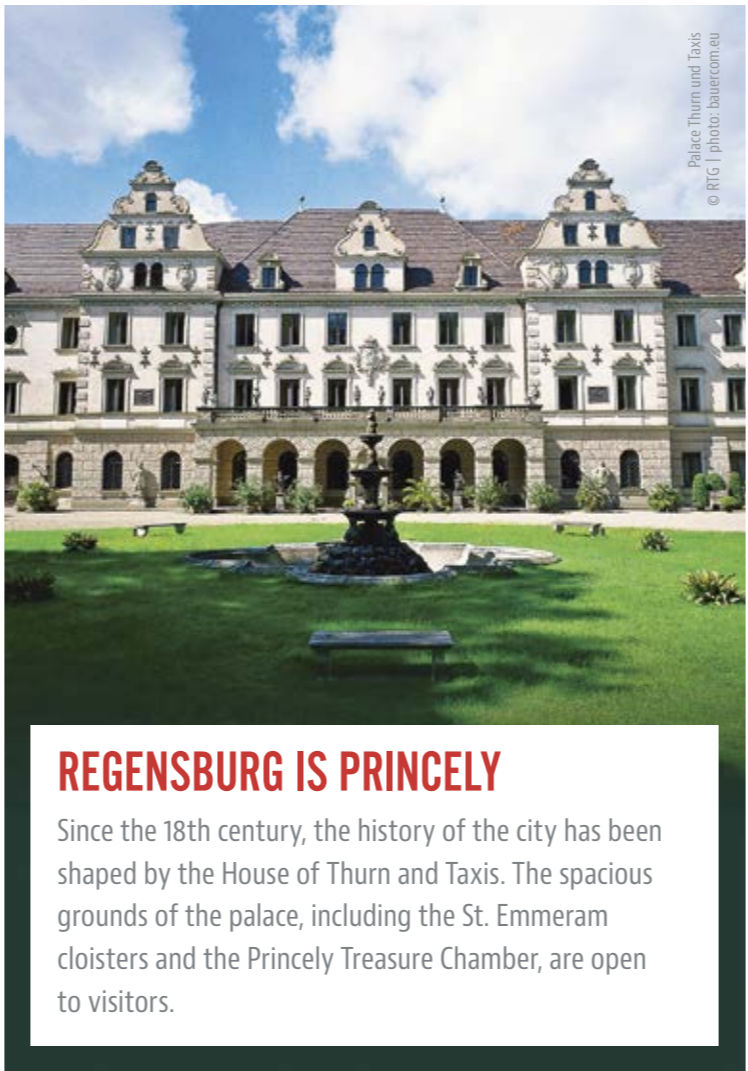

**REGENSBURG IS THE DOMSPATZEN BOYS' CHOIR**

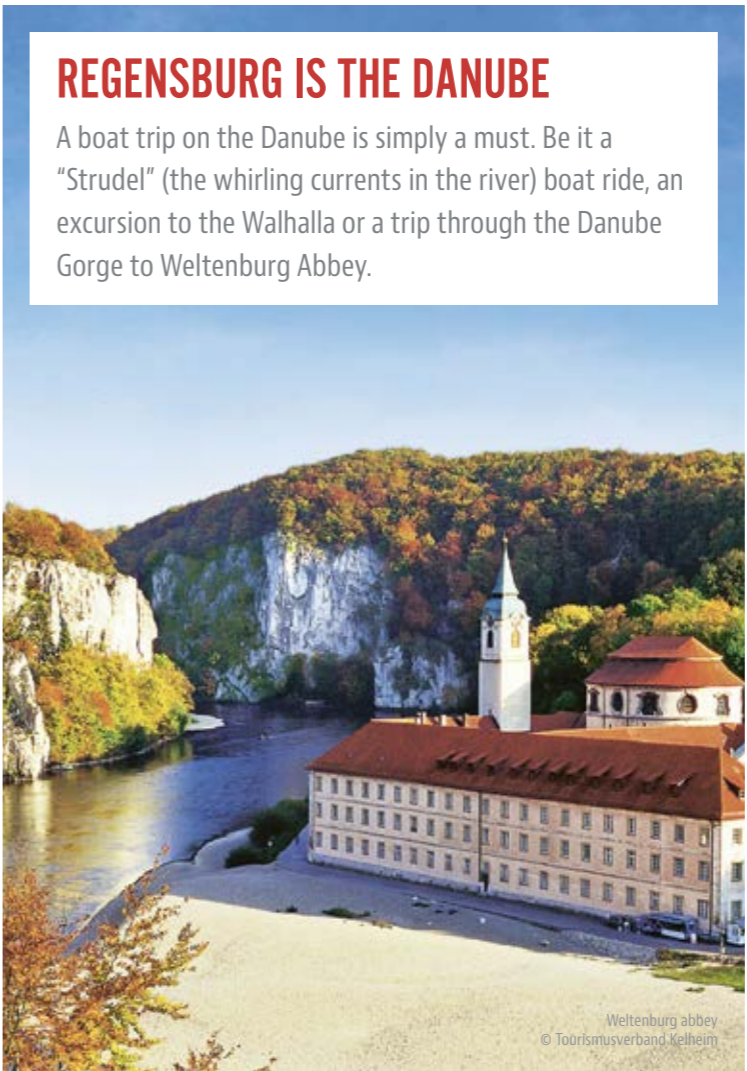

**REGENSBURG IS PRINCELY**

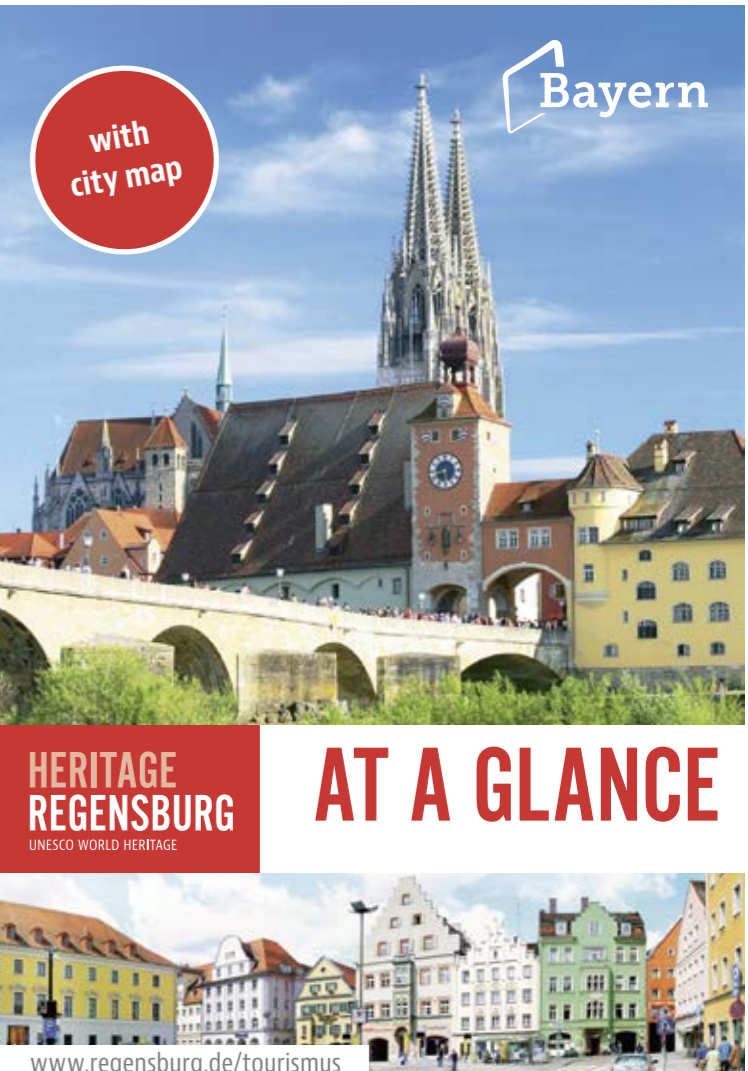
